		of time has been spent in putting individual therapy programmes for pupils where needed. This
		has had a significant impact on the individual students' ability to regulate their own levels of
		anxiety which has supported them to attend to learning. This has also had a significant impact on
		pupil behaviour with improvements in behaviour for pupils.

		parents and students in Key stage 4 above. She has organised and run 'learning' coffee mornings
		for Early Years, developing play and communication and also sensory strategies. She has also
		organised training such as Speakeasy, enabling parents to have difficult conversation with their
		child about their sexual health.
		The impact of this has been the increased consistency for young people between home and
		school. The benefits of children spending time with peers at clubs and respite facilities, enabling
		parents to have a break but also the children to experience new social activities.
