Arts Award	£1,000	During the academic year 2016 – 2017, seven pupils benefitted from being in small groups working towards accreditation by Arts Award. The pupils involved benefitted from meeting artists working in different media, working with pupils from main stream schools, experiencing a range of new art media and visiting Bridport Arts Centre on several occasions to view exhibitions and participate in workshops. Thus, the benefits were not only in terms of progress in the visual arts, but also in enrichment and development of social skills. Pupils were able to produce high quality work of which they were very proud. All seven pupils received accreditation.
Walking in the Community	£1,000	1:1 or 2:1 support for regular walks formed part of a therapeutic and health programme for pupils. Pupils are fitter, happier and home life reported as more settled
Magdalen Farm	£6,400	Weekly visits to the farm to develop self-esteem and confidence in working in the natural environment, trying new activities and team working. Weekly activities have taken place and pupils gained work experience and confidence in these areas. Pupils have also gained awards such as John Muir and ASDAN
Riding	£2,500	Blocks of lessons for riding that develop skill, empathy, fitness and enjoyment. Riding lessons have taken place, pupils are confident, their skills have improved, they report that they enjoy this and care for the horses.
ELSA	£1,831.42	Continuing weekly, and where needed, daily ELSA sessions provided to students on a 1:1 basis ensured that pupils' emotional wellbeing and resilience were supported and developed. Student wellbeing has continued to be supported as needed; this can be highlighted through reductions in negative behaviours
